



IATSE LOCAL 891 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORM

In 1998, IATSE Local 891 created a scholarship program to assist members and dependents in pursuing diploma or degree granting post-secondary studies. The scholarships are awarded primarily on the academic achievements of the applicant with significant consideration given to additional achievements and merits.



PLEASE READ THE APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS CAREFULLY:

The deadline for application is April 30, 2012, after which time the Good and Welfare Scholarship Review Panel will evaluate and award the scholarships. To ensure that adjudication is based solely on merit, applications will be kept anonymous. In a case of dispute about standing and eligibility, the Good and Welfare Committee shall be last resort and final arbiter.

SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS ARE LIMITED TO RECEIVING A MAXIMUM OF TWO (2) SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS FROM IATSE LOCAL 891, PER LIFETIME.

IATSE LOCAL 891 SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

Scholarships are administered entirely by IATSE Local 891 — Applicants must apply directly to the Union.

- Five (5) scholarships of \$5,000 each are awarded annually to members (in good standing) and dependents of members (at the time of application) of IATSE Local 891.^{1,3} Scholarships are awarded to a student enrolled full time in any undergraduate or graduate program which relates to film, video, or theatre at any Canadian or international accredited post-secondary institution.
- Five (5) scholarships of \$5,000 each are awarded annually to members (in good standing) and dependents of members (at the time of application) of IATSE Local 891. ^{1,3} Scholarships are awarded to a student enrolled full time in any other discipline in an undergraduate or graduate program at any Canadian or international accredited post-secondary institution.

REQUIRED CRITERIA:

- A minimum of a 3.0 grade point average (high school or last semester of full study). ²
- Must be enrolled in a full-time program in pursuit of a degree or professional designation.
- The Canadian or International institution of choice, must be accredited.

LETTER OF INTRODUCTION:

A letter (8.5" x 11" paper, single-sided only, business format) that provides the following information:

- reasons for eligibility for the scholarship
- purpose for seeking post-secondary education
- proposed program of study
- educational and social achievements
- extracurricular and community service activities
- employment in the last two years

Please note: you may proceed with your application without providing proof of enrolment in the required program, but funds will only be released to you after proof of enrolment is provided to us.

¹ A "dependent" is a person aged 26 or younger who is dependent for income and livelihood on a member in good standing, and whose income for the year does not exceed the basic personal amount for the year as provided in paragraph (c) of the description of B in subsection 118 (1) of the Income Tax Act, or a spouse of any age (common-law, and of either sex) who is dependent for income and livelihood upon a partner; a member in good standing.

² The GPA average is usually applied to young candidates moving from high school to college. For mature students, GPA achievements 10 to 30 years ago may be of little relevance in light of subsequent achievements and life experience. Applications of equal achievement are decided based on a secret ballot of the panel.

³ Scholarships are a taxable benefit; only the first \$500 is exempt. In compliance with the Income Tax Act of Canada T4A slips will be issued.

⁴ Scholarship funds will only be released once proof of enrolment and an original transcript has been verified.
