Actsafes STAR System



Actsafes is the not-for profit association dedicated to the promotion of workplace health and safety in the Motion Picture and Performing Arts industries in British Columbia. Governed by the industry for the industry, their mandate includes providing industry related health & safety information, education, and training. When the industry perceives a need, Actsafes responds.

The Actsafes STAR (Safety Training and Records) System is an online database intended to record and track worker training and certifications. In the STAR System, workers are able to record their training and track expiry dates. Their personal profile page can be printed and attached to their resume to list their training. Employers can access worker training information, review certifications online, exercising the due diligence required by WorkSafeBC and Federal law. A variety of Actsafes STAR courses are 100% reimbursable by IATSE Local 891 where a course fee is charged. The same courses taken outside of Actsafes will be reimbursed 100% up to the cost of Actsafes.

The deadline for submission of 2022 course receipts is on a quarterly basis.

Departmental Training



Each department submits an annual proposal to the Executive Committee for funding approval. At the end of the calendar year, access to funds expires and the department then reviews and re-submits a new proposal for the following year. If there's a course you'd like to see included in your department's training, contact the Department Chairs or Co-Chairs or attend your Departmental meetings.

Reimbursements

To be reimbursed for training, you must be in good standing and a primary member of the department for which the training is approved. You must also have worked a minimum of 30 days on an IATSE 891 production over the last three years.

Please provide Training with a copy of the receipt and confirmation of successful completion within the applicable quarterly deadline. On-line receipts are now accepted. Email: training@iatse.com.

Once the training has been approved for reimbursement and process reimbursement. Accounting will contact you to arrange payment.

Reimbursements are processed in the budgetary calendar in which the expenses were incurred with quarterly deadlines. For example, if you took a course in March 2022, the final deadline to submit receipts would be April 15, 2022.

Should you have any indebtedness to the Local, by submitting for reimbursement you are giving the Local permission to deduct all outstanding indebtedness from your reimbursement.
